3-6

This week we have been continuing to build upon our skills writing informative texts. Our learning wall is growing at a rapid rate as we immerse ourselves in both context- learning in the past- and technique- language and structure. This week's focus has been on developing effective 'Topic Sentences' to begin our paragraphs. We have explored a number of topic sentence structures including 'generalisations', 'lists', '2 nouns, 2 commas' and 'occasion/position'. 'Generalisations' help the reader to get an overall picture of the topic, 'lists' detail the information coming up in the paragraph, '2 nouns, 2 commas' is a strong technique seen in many non-fiction texts and 'occasion/position' informs the reader of a resulting consequence of an event.

Generalisations:

"All sloths are slow mammals who eat fruit and flowers and live high up in the trees." Matilda

"The whole population of young, Aboriginal children in the 1930s were at risk of being part of the Stolen Generation." Olivia Have a look at these great examples of each technique:

2 nouns, 2 commas:

"Tutenkhamen, the boy king, was a ruler of Ancient Egypt." Georgina N.

"Kallum, a boy gamer, plays Fortnite and Minecraft." Kallum

Occasion/ Position:

"When an F1 driver goes around a 90° corner, they can experience up to 3Gs!" Angus

"Whenever we learn about Toyota Hiluxes, we study gear boxes, diffs and how much power and torque they have." Henry

Lists:

"T-rex dinosaurs were powerful, carnivorous, strong and large."

"Horses were used in the olden days for transport, carting food and goods and for farm work like pulling ploughs." Emily R.


